



Mark N. He is handling an investment treaty arbitration for Slovenian investors against Bosnia & Herzegovina; suing Germany for a U.S. citizen alleging expropriation of land without adequate compensation; and he is litigating several terrorism claims by Americans against nations on the U.S. list of "State Sponsors of Terrorism."
